Richard - DHR - Summary, Key Issues and Recommendations

Richard, a 32-year-old male, died by suicide in March 2022. The review concluded that domestic abuse—primarily emotional, economic, and controlling behaviour from his mother-in-law and later his wife—was a contributory factor. Richard had a history of mental health issues but was well-regarded at work. He disclosed abuse to colleagues and attempted to seek help via male domestic abuse helplines on the day of his death.

Key Issues

- Familial Abuse Awareness: Colleagues recognised harmful behaviour but did not identify it as domestic abuse.
- **Missed Opportunities for Disclosure**: GP and antenatal appointments did not explore family stress or provide safe opportunities to make any disclosures.
- **Employer Preparedness**: No domestic abuse or suicide policy; staff lacked training to identify and escalate concerns.
- **Support for Male Victims**: Limited local provision before October 2022; stigma and lack of awareness hindered access.
- **Neurodiversity & Mental Health**: Richard's vulnerabilities were exploited; autism traits and depression increased risk

Recommendations

- **National**: Launch a campaign to raise awareness of familial abuse among the public and employers.
- Local Cambridgeshire DASV: Promote familial abuse awareness and available support pathways.
- Public Health: Publicise STOP Suicide training to businesses; adapt suicide prevention for neurodiverse individuals.
- Metropolitan Police: Audit victim contact satisfaction in DA cases.
- **GP Practices**: Implement processes to explore domestic abuse when family stress is mentioned.
- Continue multi-agency training on domestic abuse, including familial abuse, for frontline staff.
