Information leaflet for professionals



What is domestic abuse?

Any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive and or threatening behaviour, violence or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are or have been intimate partners or immediate family members regardless of gender or sexuality. This can encompass but is not limited to the following types of abuse:

- psychological
- physical
- sexual
- financial
- emotional

Anyone can experience domestic abuse regardless of age, gender, race, ethnic or religious group, class, sexuality, disability or lifestyle.

Who are we?

The Independent Domestic Violence Advisors (IDVA) team are based at the Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH) at Godmanchester and at the Victim's and Witness Hub in Peterborough. The IDVA team work across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

IDVA's provide an independent service offering crisis (short term) intervention and support to high risk victims (scoring 14 or over on the Safe Lives DASH Risk Indicator checklist, or on professional judgement of high risk).

There are also specialist client based IDVA's that cover Cambridgeshire only and take referrals at all risk levels:

- The Young People's IDVA works with 13-19 year olds who are experiencing abuse in their own intimate relationships (up to 25 if they have a diagnosed learning or physical disability or mental health issue, or where they are ex-LAC). Cambridgeshire only.
- A8 IDVA works with victims and survivors from Eastern European A8 countries. Cambridgeshire only.
- The Health IDVA is based at Addenbrookes Hospital and takes referrals from hospital based services and midwifery across Cambridgeshire only.
- Stalking and Harassment IDVA who supports victims of Harassment and Stalking who are victims of domestic abuse and non-DA harassment/ stalking across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

What does the service offer victims?

IDVA's are able to:

- Talk through clients' options and give information to help them make decisions;
- Advocate on behalf of clients with other partner services on behalf of their clients, such as housing.
- Assist with personal safety planning for clients and their children in order to reduce risk;
- Support clients through the civil and criminal justice proceedings.

We are able to offer advice to professionals around risk and available DA services. Sadly, we cannot accept self-referrals, only via professionals. If you are unsure always ask us for advice on 01480 847718 (professionals only)

What is a MARAC?

MARAC is a multi-agency risk assessment conference that is held three times a week to review the most high risk DV cases. Cases that require a more in depth discussion are taken to a professionals meeting. Referrals to MARAC should be made by use of the Safe Lives DASH; the threshold for MARAC is 17 ticks on the DASH and client consent is not essential. Scores on 14-16 can be referred to IDVA Service with client consent. Evidenced professional judgement of risk is more important than the score. Professionals can refer by using the Safe Lives DASH questionnaire Risk Assessment tool. This will assist them to measure current risk.
